

**The City of Chicago ordinance provides that:**

- **No person shall bring or lead any dog in any park, unless it is held by a leash not more than six feet long**
- **No person shall bring more than three dogs to any park**
- **No person shall appear with a pet within a public place without some means for the removal of excrement**
- **Any excrement deposited by a pet shall be removed by the person appearing with the pet**

***Full text:***

**10-36-020 Animals prohibited.**

**No person shall bring or lead any dog in any park, public playground or airport unless it is held by a leash, not more than six feet long,** except in park areas designated and posted by the City of Chicago or by the general superintendent of the Chicago Park District to be “dog friendly areas” and no person shall bring or lead any dog or other animal onto the premises of any bathing beach except in beach areas designated and posted by the general superintendent of the Chicago Park District to be “dog friendly areas”, and at such hours also designated and posted by the general superintendent of the Chicago Park District. **No person shall bring more than three dogs to any park or beach area.** However, these restrictions will not apply to dogs utilized by police for patrol purposes.

**7-12-420 Removal of excrement.**

**No person shall appear with a pet** upon the public ways or **within public places** or upon the property of another, absent that person's consent, **without some means for the removal of excrement; nor shall any person fail to remove any excrement deposited by such pet.** This section shall not apply to a blind person while walking his or her guide dog.
